

GAME NOTES

- ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Rockford IceHogs won 2-1 on Wednesday to take the first in a two-game mini-series against the Manitoba Moose and to help in their pursuit of a playoff spot. However, the last time the IceHogs defeated the Moose in back-to-back contests at Bell MTS Iceplex was from March 26-28 of 2018. Since that pair of wins, Rockford is 1-3-1-0 when visiting Manitoba.
- ANYTHING YOU CAN DO, I CAN DO BETTER: Brandon Hagel set the IceHogs' season-long goal streak when he buried goals in back-to-back-to-back contests from Jan. 31-Feb. 4. However, John Quenne-ville scored Wednesday to extend his own goal-scoring streak to four games, which sets the team's new season-long streak.
- **BACK AT IT AGAIN:** Entering this week's mini-series with the Moose, the IceHogs have 10 sets of back-to-back games in the final two and a half months of the season, including three instances in which the team plays three games in three days. Accounting for Wednesday's victory over the Moose, Rockford is 8-5-0-2 in the first half of back-to-backs and 6-7-1-0 in the back half of back-to-backs in 2019-20.
- **THE RIGHT TRACK:** After going 0-for-14 on the power play across five games from Jan. 15-22 and falling to 31st in the AHL in power play rankings, the IceHogs have now netted eight power-play goals across their last eight matchups, going 8-for-36 (22.2%) in that span and jumping to 29th in the league with a success rate of 12.3% on the season.
- **GOALS GALORE:** After only scoring three goals in a game twice from Dec. 21-Jan. 22, the IceHogs have now notched more than two goals in a game four times in their last eight outings.





Dylan Sikura dished an assist in Wednesday's win over the Moose to extend his career-long point streak to eight games in which he's tallied 11 points (3g, 8a). He leads the team in points per game (.85) and plus/minus (+11).



Lucas Carlsson added another assist on Wednesday and has now set up five goals during his current career-high four-game point streak. He is tied with Tyler Sikura for the team-lead in assists with 18.



The Manitoba Moose host the Rockford IceHogs for the second time in as many days after the Hogs took the first half of this backto-back series 2-1 on Wednesday. Rockford looks to win back-toback games in Manitoba for the first time since March 26-28 of 2018 and climb the Central Division standings in the rematch on Thursday. The Hogs sit in sixth place in the division with 49 points while the Moose sit in eighth with 44. C.J. Suess netted the lone goal for Manitoba in Wednesday's matchup against the IceHogs. He is second on the Moose roster in goals (13) and points against Rockford this year with five (3g, 2a) through seven games.
