GAME NOTES

- **NIGHTMARE ON ELM STREET:** Rockford is averaging 4.7 goals/ game over the last three home games against the Wild dating to Jan. 6 of last season. Rockford has scored 3+ goals in each of those last three games at the BMO Harris Bank Center and combined for 14 total goals in that stretch.

- MULTIPLICITY: Four IceHogs skaters tallied multi-point efforts Wednesday in MacKenzie Entwistle (1g, 1a), Matthew Highmore (2a), Reese Johnson (1g, 1a) and Nick Moutrey (1g, 1a). The total is four times the amount of total multi-point games by Rockford skaters prior to Wednesday, as Tyler Sikura ranked as the team's lone skater with a multi-point effort (2g on Oct. 19) through the first seven contests of 2019-20.




